European perspective and connectivity of the Western Balkans



- 1) Conclusions on EU Enlargement and the Stabilization and Association Process - the EC will publish a Strategy for the WB countries in February 2018 and the Regular Enlargement Report on April 2018
- 2) Strengthening security cooperation and initiatives to counter terrorism, organized crime, border security and Rule of Law in the Western Balkans region
- 3) Initiative for digital connectivity with a step-by-step adoption of the EU roaming rules by the WB countries as well, aiming for a gradual reduction of roaming charges and increase in broadband internet access opportunities
- 4) Encouraging regional cooperation and good interconnectivity as 'vital' preconditions to establish a secure, well-functioning and accessible energy network


















Cultural Programme
